Participants

Number: 568 children **Location:** Morogoro, Tanzania

Mean Age: 4.8 years





Methodology



Type:

Randomized Controlled Trial

Comparison:

Children assigned to watch "Akili and Me" vs. other popular programs.

Duration:

Measured learning outcomes before and after four weeks of exposure.

Tool: International Development & Early Learning Assessment (IDELA)

Drawing Skills



Conclusion

- Educational cartoons like Akili and Me positively impact early learning skills.
